Dear Kennett Library friend and patron,

It is time to build a new library!

The Kennett Library has been serving our community for over 125 years. Located in the heart of Kennett Square, it has always been a special place to meet your neighbor, attend a program, learn something new and introduce a child to the love of reading. Built in 1961, our current library keeps us from providing the most up to date civic, literary and information services you need and deserve.

For the last 20 years, we have been in a community dialog about what you would like to see in a new library. Many have dared to dream! What is envisioned will be so much more than just a library, it will also be a portal for information and resources and a hub for community engagement. Construction of the new Kennett Library & Resource Center will begin later this fall and the grand opening is planned for February 2023.

The new Kennett Library & Resource Center will offer:

- Flexible spaces for you to gather, resources to grow new ideas, and state of the art technology accessible to everyone.
- An auditorium for movies, small concerts, lectures, workshops and more.
- Classrooms for programs and educational opportunities. You can learn how to speak a new language, improve your financial skills, paint, sew, knit, publish your own book and more.
- The Adult Literacy Program will have classrooms and offices to continue teaching ESL, GED, and American citizenship classes.
- Computer stations; WIFI connectivity both inside and out; classes can be streamed, recorded and accessed across the world.

This new Library & Resource Center is estimated to cost \$20 million. An extraordinary community of people who care about Southern Chester County have already committed \$13 million toward this goal. It includes representatives from the State, County, local municipal governments, private foundations and caring individuals. We thank them for their leadership.

Building on its role as a community resource, the new Kennett Library will offer ample gathering space and new venues for outreach, partnership, and community development.

Included in the facility is a 110-seat auditorium that will host all kinds of community events, including concerts, author talks, theater productions, community events, meetings, Ted Talks, movies and so much more. As part of our Capital Campaign, we are offering the community the opportunity to sponsor a seat and thereby, leave a lasting legacy in the Kennett Library & Resource Center.

A \$2,500 donation gives you a personalized auditorium seat and includes two lines of text on a brass plaque on the back of the seat.

The Melton Terrace


"In recognition of Dennis Melton's outstanding community spirit and long-time support of the Kennett Library, the Board has named the rooftop Terrace in his honor."

Dennis maintained that arts, culture, and diversity are integral to building healthy communities. This was evident in his work with local nonprofits including, the MLK Breakfast, the Kennett Flash, the Summer Park Concert Series, and the Southern Chester County Chamber of Commerce. Dennis also believed that an inclusive, accessible library is an essential component of a diverse, vibrant community.

Dennis served as the current Architect of Record for the new Kennett Library & Resource Center. Upon filing the final development plans with the Borough of Kennett Square shortly before his death, he wrote, "It is an honor to participate in this important milestone."
